Unitex Brings Home Four Awards at Annual Industry Event

ALEXANDRIA, Va., April 18, 2024 — Individuals and operations were honored by their peers for outstanding efforts in the linen, textiles and facilities services industry at the TRSA Annual Industry Awards Dinner during the 14th Annual Legislative Conference in Washington, DC on April 10. This honor was bestowed among 60 awards to member companies and individuals present at the event in 11 categories of awards

Unitex Healthcare Laundry Services, Elmsford, NY was one of four TRSA members to win four awards. Charles Edelman received the Volunteer Leadership Award. CEO Rob Potack was honored individually (Company Community Service) for his leadership of the Mount Vernon Boys and Girls Club. Unitex won for company wide community service, too, and took home a Best Video award for its virtual plant tour of its New Brunswick, NJ, facility.

Honored individuals and operations include:

Company Community Service Award – Unitex Healthcare Laundry Services was honored as a company for a vast array of philanthropic efforts in their community. The company received a video nomination for their support of the Ronald McDonald House Charities from the organization's CEO, Michele D'Amore. In addition to their support of the Ronald McDonald House Charities, they were honored for their support of the American Heart Association, their seat on the Board of Newburgh, NY Community Land Bank and for adopting a school. The CEO of Unitex Healthcare Laundry Services, Robert Potack was honored as an individual for his position as is president of the Boys and Girls Club of Mount Vernon, which serves more than 800 youths and over 1,500 locals through a variety of club-directed programs. Potack previously served on the club's Board of Director's.

Best Video Award – Unitex Healthcare Laundry Services was honored as an organization for a comprehensive virtual tour of one of their facilities. The beautifully shot acute care processing virtual facility tour showcased all of the people and processes involved in processing over 1 million pounds of linen weekly.

For decades, Edelman has been a steadfast contributor to TRSA education programs as a speaker and organizer, including the Maintenance Management Institute or MMI.
